March LFC Meeting

March regular meeting will be be held at WestLex at 6:30pm on Tuesday, March 12th. We'll send out a Zoom invite for those who cannot attend in person.

Wash/Wax Event - Sunday, 4/28/2024

Our Spring Wash/Wax Event is scheduled on Sunday, 4/28/24 from 1pm to 4pm RAIN OR SHINE.

Bring a soft terry cloth towel you can donate to the cause. Step ladders and beds of pick-em-up trucks come in handy as well! If you attend both events each year you'll get a \$50 flying credit; attend neither and you'll be assessed a \$50 penalty; attend one and you break even!

\$.20 Will get you Re-fueling service from the Avgas truck

Now that an av-gas fuel truck is available at WestLex, you have the option of refueling yourself at the self-serve fuel pump or you can call for the truck and have them re-fuel you in your tie-down spot. They charge \$0.20/gallon for the service over and above the self-serve price.

There will probably be times when that service is well worth it !

Winter Pre-heat \$1 per reservation entry: December Through March

Every winter we add a \$1 per reservation entry to help offset the rebate provided to pilots who have the airplanes pre-heated. The LFC reimburses \$15 for each pre-heat receipt turned in.

Reminder: Make sure this info is on every gas receipt that you turn in

- 1) Your Name (printed but not a signature)
- 2) Transaction Date
- 3) Tail number
- 4) # of gallons purchased
- 5) \$\$ amount of the purchase

Preferable way to send in the receipts is to drop them off in the cash box on top of the supply cabinet in the back right corner of our hangar. If you have to email them, send images of the receipts to our Club Officer Mike Smith at mike@photonetcafe.com

Club is offering five options to pay your LFC Bill

- 1) ACH Payment: For a monthly cost of less than a stamp and a check, (\$0.34), you can sign up and have your bill payment automatically deducted from your checking account on the 25th of each month. - 3) Snail Mail Check / Money Order to Club PO Box
- 4) Drop Check / Money Order off in Cash Box in our hangar
- 5) Use your Bank to have them send an electronic payment to PO Box

Here the trick; how to seamlessly open the hangar door lock

Larry Sward passed along this great tip for getting into the hangar with no hassles. When you insert the key into the lock, turn it 90 degrees clockwise and, with the key in that position, pull down on the door handle. Voila! Failure to turn key in the right direction or not pulling the handle with the key in the right position can cause problems for you.

To Satisfy Badge Audit: Request for Badge Number and Expiration Date

LFC Badge Holders: When you first get your badge **AND** when you renew your badge, please go to the club website and click on the "HELLO xxx" "link at the top right of the page. Click on "edit details" and scroll down to where you see your badge info; update the badge number and the expiration date; then be sure to click on the SAVE button to save your entries. The airport requires us to tell them what our members badge numbers are and the expiration dates in two badge audits each year. Your input here will make those audits go MUCH smoother! <u>Tie-down Ropes replaced with Straps (Watch the video)</u>

Over the years, we have found that pilots don't use the proper tie-down

rope hitches and then the birds flop around in the wind with loose ropes. To address that issue, the tie-down ropes for our birds have been replaced with strips that are more reliably tightened and remain so. Here is a video to show you the new straps and how to use them.

Valet Re-Fueling Service Available

If you find yourself in a big hurry or simply want to avoid standing out on a wintry airplane tarmac, WestLex will refuel and tie down a bird for you for a price \$.50 per gallon higher than the going rate at the self service fuel pump. So... you have options! The current plane hourly rates are based on \$6.50 per gallon of avgas, so it might not cost you anything out of pocket to have the WestLex folks re-fuel the bird for you.

152 Sold; Search Committee being formed

We sadly say goodbye to our C-152; it is winging its way up to the Fleming Mason Airport to be a part of a new flight school there. We are in the process of forming a search committee for a replacement aircraft. N61622 will be designated as the primary trainer and we removed the \$8/hr surcharge on that airplane for our Restricted Members, effective September 1 2023.

Bad News from our Maintenance Shop; Hourly rates went up

Thoroughbred Maintenance informed us that they are being forced to raise their hourly rates from \$93.75/hr to \$105.00/hr effective November $1^{\rm st}$ 2023. We adjusted our hourly rates to reflect this additional cost. Those rates went into effect on November $1^{\rm st}$.

Links to Get Familiar with new Avionics in N65641

Hey Everyone,

N65641 has new avionics. There's going to be a learning curve with the new gear, so I recommend pilots hunt down some YouTube videos and spend a little time on the ground to familiarize themselves before they go flying. There is no longer a vacuum system in the airplane. It has been replaced with an electronic ADAHRS system.

Here's an overview of the changes:

Garmin G5 - replaces the Al

Garmin GI275 - replaces the DG

Garmin GPS175 - replaces the KLN94 GPS

Garmin GMX200 - replaced the KMD550 MFD

I've pulled together a few helpful resources.

Garmin G5 Attitude Indicator+

We have one in the Diamond, so some pilots should be familiar with it.

This is the new touch-screen successor to the G5. It has A LOT of capabilities and will interface with the GPS and autopilot.

N65641 Becomes a TAA Aircraft



Our C-172R, N65641, received a Garmin avionics upgrade that allows it to be classified as a Technically Advanced Aircraft (TAA) which will mean it can be used to train and test for the Commercial Pilot License. The HI, AI, GPS and moving map units were replaced with newer Garmin avionics.

Check your badge – Be sure to renew on or before the expiration date

One LFC member got hit for \$50 when he went to renew his badge. Be sure to renew on or BEFORE the expiration date to pay only \$15 instead of \$50. If you lose your badge, be sure to 'fess up and contact the Airport. Failure to account for the badge will cost you your \$150 badge deposit. If you choose not to renew the badge, you still must surrender the old one to avoid the fine.

Badge System at KLEX carries \$150 penalty for the club per badge holder

The badge system implemented at the airport comes with a hefty \$150 fine for the club if a member fails to turn in a badge. In order to get a badge, each member is asked to pony up a \$150 refundable deposit to the club. Then, if the member goes inactive, quits, loses a badge, carries an expired badge, or is deemed financially delinquent, and the member fails to turn in their badge, they will lose their \$150 deposit. Note: We have been advised that public safety officers will be sent to attempt to retrieve a badge if the member fails to heed the clubs demand for return of the badge.

Higher prices are going into effect for new member badges and for eventual renewal of badges: \$50 for a new badge and \$15 to renew.

Another new requirement: Plan on getting your badge renewed BEFORE it expires; waiting until after it

expires will force the club to demand the return of the expired badge and the airport will force you to go through the FBI fingerprint and the whole new badge process and charge you \$50 instead of \$15.

N13821 Has Alt-hold Auto Pilot

To bring our latest acquisition up to the level of the bird it replaced, we installed a autopilot that will climb and descend to an altitude and hold it; it will track a heading bug or or a GPS signal. With the addition of this equipment, the airplane now qualifies as a Technically Advanced Aircraft (TAA) and can be used to take the commercial SEL checkride.

Please Re-install new pitot tube covers

In light of our recent bug-in-the-pitot-tube infestation, we have installed pitot tube covers on all the aircraft. Please reinstall them after each flight and let us know if one goes missing! (Note: the 152 has a built in cover)



Here is a quick reminder / tutorial on a unique savings opportunity that the club offers to you

As those hourly rates continue to inch upward, here is a link that we have on our website, reminding potential members about the savings that result because we charge on the tach NOT the hobbs. Click Here

(Except for over-night reservations) - Wait 30 minutes and the bird is yours

If you are standing on the ramp on a sunny afternoon and a bird is just sitting there begging to be flown, be aware that the bird can be yours IF the current reservation is 30 minutes old. The reservation system will let you schedule a standby reservation over the top of a reservation once 30 minutes from the start of that reservation has elapsed. **DO NOT take the bird without scheduling it however.**

If YOU are the one who booked the original reservation and you are simply running late, be sure to get on the reservation system before the 30 minutes has elapsed and cancel and re-book the plane from the current time to the end of the original reservation period.

EXCEPTION: The reservation system will NOT allow scheduling over the top of overnight reservations; if you suspect a problem there, it will take an officer to make a decision. If someone has not cancelled an overnight reservation, he/she will be liable for a hour of flying (2 hours on Saturday or Sunday).

Track the last flight (that flew on an FAA flight plan) for the birds of our fleet!

Motion Passed To Provide Rebates/Surcharges On Gas Purchases

The proposal to grant rebates to members who buy gas at airports cheaper than the going Tac Air rate, and conversely, to reimburse only the Tac Air rate if fuel is purchased at a price higher than the going Tac Air rate has passed by a vote of 40 to 7. Buying 10 gallons of avgas at a rate fifty cents cheaper than Tac Air's rate would result in a credit on your bill for the amount of the purchase plus an additional \$5.00 rebate. Buying 10 gallons of avgas at a rate fifty cents more expensive than Tac Air's rate would result in only being reimbursed the Tac Air rate. In 2021, this procedure saved members, roughly \$10/hr on the rate on the airplanes.

Cessna 172R - N65641



If you check the schedule you will see this addition to the fleet. N65641 was purchased locally and some club members flew it when it was on leaseback with Aerotech. Here are a couple of links to help you get familiar with the bird. If you haven't flown an airplane with fuel injection, get an hour checkout with a CFI to help you get up to speed!

Since the engine is more expensive, we set the hourly rate \$1.50 more than the other Cessna's.

The larger size fuel tanks (53 gal useable) in this bird are both a blessing and a curse. With just one or two on board, the extra range is a terrific bonus. But if you want to carry three or four folks, it is a problem.

Fortunately, you can fill to the bottom of the filler necks in the tanks and only have 35 gallons useable on board (17.5 gal useable in each tank). Now you can fill to the "tabs" and elect to add, say, 2.5 gallons more per side for a total of 40 gallons available. Of course you'll have to do this yourself or instruct/monitor the fuel guy attentively!

Diamond Star - DA-40 N213DS

Checkouts are available from CFI's who have been approved by the Club's Safety Officer. Contact Larry Sward if you are a CFI or if you (as a FULL LFC member) would like to arrange for your CFI to be approved for DA-40 checkouts.

Club Operations at the 9/27 Westside Airport Complex (WESTLEX)

We have moved club operations over to a box hangar and tie-down spaces over on the 9/27 runway. Operations started February 1, 2015 Car access is from the crash/rescue entrance off Versailles Road. That road has been named George Gumbert Road. Self Serve fuel is available (see blue box below). We have a battery powered tug to make it easy to move birds around. Also, recently purchased is a small air compressor and an air tank that can be used to inflate tires. All birds are tied down except the DA-40; to make room for a bird to be hangered for frosty morning departures.

All fuel purchases will require use of your credit card; turn in your gas receipts just as if you bought fuel elsewhere.
